This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these special purpose financial statements prepared for the purpose outlined above.

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1. General Information :

PT Sriwijaya Bintang Tiga Energi incorporated in Indonesia, was established on 18th January 2005 through Notarial Deed No. 25 of Public Notary Mala Mukti, SH, LLM. The Company is under development stage. The purpose and objective of the Company is to engage in general minning and support service.

2. Significant Accounting Policies :

Basis of preparation, measurement and significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

a) Basis of Preparation

Compliance with Ind AS

The financial statement of the company have been prepared in accordance with indian Accounting Standards ("Ind AS") notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 as amended and relevent provisions of the Companies Act, 2013("The Act")

Historical cost convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the following :
Certain financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value

b) Property, Plant and equipment :-

All other items of property, plant and equipment are stated at historical cost which includes capitalised borrowing cost less depreciation and impairment loss, if any. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items. Subsequent costs are included in the assets carrying amount or recognised as a seperate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of item can be maesured reliably. The carrying amount of any component accounted for as a seperate asset is derecognised when replaced. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to profit or loss during the reporting period in which they are incurred.

Expenditure incurred on assets which are not ready for their intended use comprising direct cost, related incidental expenses and attributable borrowing cost are disclosed under Capital Work in Progress

Depreciation method :

Depreciation is provided to the extent of depreciable amount on straight Line Method(SLM) based on useful life.

c) Investments and other financial assets

Classification

The Company classifies its financial assets in the following measurement category :

- those to be measured subsequently at fair value through profit or loss
- those measured at amortised cost

Contributed equity :

Equity shares are calssified as equity, incremental costs directly attributable to the issue of new shares or options are shown in equity as a deduction, netof tax, from the proceeds.

d) Provisions and Contingent Liabilities/Assets

Provisions:

Provisions are recognised when there is present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events, it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation; and the amount has been reliably estimated.

Provisions are measured at the present value of management's best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the present obligation at the end of reporting period. The discount rate used to determine the present value is pre-tax rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the liability. The increase in the provision due to the passage of time is recognised as interest expenses.

Contingent liabilities

Contingent liabilities are disclosed when there is a possible obligation arising from past events, the existence of which will be confirmed only by occurence or non occurence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly with in the control of the Company. A present obligation that arises from past events where it is either not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle or reliable estimate of the amount cannot be made, is termed as contingent liability

Contingent Assets

A contingent asset is disclosed, where an inflow of economic benefits is probable.

e) Foreign Currency Translation :

- i) Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rates prevailing at the dates of the transactions
- ii) All exchange differences arising on reporting on foreign currency monetary items at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded are recognised in the statement of Profit and Loss.
- iii) Non-monetary items denominated in foreign currency are stated at the rates prevailing on the date of the transactions/ exchange rate at which transaction is actually effected.

Foreign currency transactions are accounted at the exchange rates prevailing on the date of the transactions. Exchange differences arising on reporting of short term foreign currency monetary items at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded are recorded in the Profit and Loss Statement of account.

f) Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

g) Cash and Cash equivalents :

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, demand deposits with banks, short-term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of change in value.
